

RIP TICKETS

What are Rip Tickets?

Rip Tickets, also known as pull tabs, are small games of chance. They are named for the way they are opened, ripping or pulling the tabs open to reveal the values.

What can I win?

The prizes depend on the type of ticket you purchase. There are Instant, Cash, King Tut, and Gun games.

Instant

Instant games are much like instant lottery tickets. You will see immediately what you win on any winning ticket. The dollar value will be displayed in one of the opened windows.

Cash

Cash games can also have small instant prizes, which show in one of the windows. However, you are looking for a big red number, which is called a Holder. When you have a Holder ticket, you hold it until the winning number is drawn for that game. Some games have one winner and some have multiple winners. If the winning number matches the number on your ticket, you win the cash prize associated with that winning number.

King Tut

King Tut games are similar to Cash games, but they are progressive. When the first numbers are pulled, there are 5 pulled and each will win \$25. Then, in the second round, 4 are pulled for a prize of \$50. The third round pulls 3 numbers for a prize of \$75, the fourth round pulls 2 numbers for a prize of \$100, and the fifth and final round pulls 1 number for a prize of \$250. The winnings get added up for each winning number. So, the number that was pulled in the first round, but none of the rest, is a winner of \$25 (pink). The number that was pulled in the first and second round, but not the rest, is a winner of $\$25 + \$50 = \$75$ (green). The same process applies to the rest of the rounds. There will be other winners of $\$25 + \$50 + \$75 = \150 (yellow), $\$25 + \$50 + \$75 + \$100 = \$250$ (purple), and finally, the top winner of $\$25 + \$50 + \$75 + \$100 + \$250 = \500 (blue).



Gun

Gun games are similar to cash games, but instead of winning the cash prize indicated on the front of the ticket, the winning Holder ticket wins the specified gun. The gun prize is posted at the game where the tickets are sold.

How do I know if I won?

Instant Winner Example

Typically, one row will be the winning row, in this case the 3 gems with the line through. A different row will show your winnings, in this case, the top row showing \$50 in yellow.



Holder Example

On a Holder ticket, one of the rows will have a number, typically with red in it. You hold that ticket until all of the tickets have been sold and the winner is pulled, to determine if your holder is a winner.



Where do I see the winning number?

Near the rip ticket sales area, there are TVs displaying winning numbers. One TV has the main raffle numbers, and the other TV rotates through the various types of rip ticket games. Games are listed by game type, in order of game name, then serial number.

Winning numbers are also available using [My Raffle Buddy](#). If you have a Holder ticket, you can enter your number into your account under [Check My Numbers](#), and it will show “Winner” if your number is the pulled game winner.

How much do they cost?

Most Rip tickets are \$1 each. There are some games that are \$5 or \$20 per ticket, but those are special games and the price is clearly posted.

How do I claim my prize?

If you win a large amount of cash (\$50+) or a gun, you should report to the Prize Claim area near Rip Ticket sales. If you have a small instant winning ticket, you can go to any Rip Ticket sales line and use that ticket to buy more tickets or take the prize in cash.
